SUMMER EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

For College/Graduate Students interested in Community Service and Jewish Life

The American Jewish Society for Service is seeking energetic, mature and experienced Jewish college/graduate students to serve as counselors for our on-site six-week summer community service work project for Jewish teens. Staff must be 21 years old at the beginning of the summer program.

Two Counselors are hired for each work site, and report to the Project Directors. Their role is to support our program by living and working alongside our teens, acting as role models, mentors and guides. Each group is hosted by a local community development agency that provides housing and professionally supervised construction work for the 6-week project. During the summer the group lives together, works five days a week, travels on weekends to explore the surrounding area, and examines these experiences at they relate to core Jewish values. The counselors live on-site with the campers and project directors.

Successful applicants will have a commitment to sharing positive Jewish identity with teens, and the ability to be flexible in changing circumstances.

Other responsibilities include:

- Participating with the campers at the work site each day.
- Establishing and enforcing routines and rules for living, working and learning
- Organizing camper committees that encourage leadership and empowerment of participants
- Providing creativity and serving as a resource to our teens in such activities as Shabbat services and the summer yearbook

A valid driver's license is required as counselors frequently assist with the driving throughout the summer.

All applicants must also complete a voluntary disclosure form which will be sent to them upon AJSS's receipt of this application.

Staffing an AJSS Summer program can be as transforming an experience for staff as well as the camper by serving communities in need.
